## ACTIVITIES

### UOW Buddies Program

Students are invited and encouraged to join the UOW Buddies program which brings together new UOW College international students with Australian students from the University of Wollongong.

The objective of the UOW Buddies program is to help new international students settle in and learn about Wollongong and the University, while fostering intercultural communication for both the international and domestic students.



## ACCOMMODATION

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### Student Accommodation:

- UOW College Homestay accommodation with native English-speaking families.
- Breakfast, dinner and weekend lunches provided by host families.
- If a study tour group is departing on a morning flight from Sydney International Airport, the group may be required to stay overnight in a Sydney Airport hotel to avoid early morning disruptions to host families. An additional fee will be charged for the overnight accommodation.
- Homestay families may charge up to \$10 per week for Internet usage depending on access and cost levels.
- Students with special dietary needs (such as allergies) which require host families to adjust their standard family menu to accommodate such needs may be subject to an additional charge. This will be determined on a case-by-case basis after a detailed review of the individual student's specialised needs.

## **RESPONSIBILITIES ON YOUR GROUP PROGRAM**

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The purpose of this document is to inform you about each party's responsibilities during your program.

### **What are the students responsible for?**

The students are responsible for:

- Behaving in a safe and courteous manner
- Only taking part in activities which they are able to do. For example, a student should only participate in swimming activities if they know how to swim.
- Telling their teacher/group leader if they have a problem during the study tour.

### **What are the student's parents responsible for?**

The parents or legal guardians of the students are responsible for:

- Providing the organisers of the program with all relevant medical information.
- Telling the student's teachers/group leaders of any health issues, dietary requirements.
- Reviewing the study program to determine whether their child is capable of undertaking all of the activities in the program.

### **What are the student's teachers/group leaders responsible for?**



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At least one teacher/group leader is required for every 15 students. The teachers/group leaders accompanying the students on the Group Program are responsible for the welfare of the students and must:

- Attend the English language classes with the students.
- Attend all group activities and homestay drop-off and pick-up.
- Supervise the students during any breaks the students have during the English classes.
- Supervise the students during all activities (both activities organised in the program and activities organised by the teachers).
- **Important: Supervise means that the student is under the control of the teacher/group leader and within their sight at all times.**
- Be contactable 24 hours a day for emergencies involving the students.
- Tell homestay providers of any concerns a parent may have for a particular student.

### **What is UOW College responsible for?**

UOW College is responsible for:

- Organising the Group Program
- Being a contact point for the activities program and the homestay providers
- Providing the English language classes
- Supervising the students during the English language classes (but teachers are responsible for supervision during breaks)

### **Who is responsible for the student's homestay?**

The student's homestay arrangements are organised and provided by UOW College Homestay. UOW College Homestay is responsible for all issues regarding the student's homestay including transport by the host family.

### **Who is responsible for the structured activities?**

The structured activities are organised and provided by Sydney Educational Tours. Sydney Educational Tours are responsible for:

- The student during the structured activities
- Providing transport for the student to and from the airport to the student's homestay accommodation.

### **What are you as the coordinator of the Group Program responsible for?**

As the coordinator of the Group Program you are responsible for:

- Acting as a liaison between UOW College, the students and the teachers/group leaders.
- Providing UOW College with students' relevant medical or dietary information.
- Ensuring that the teachers/group leaders undertake their role as supervisors of the students effectively and appropriately.

## TERMS

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**On acceptance by UOW College of your booking request pursuant to this Study Tour Quotation, you agree to be bound by the following terms:**

### 1. Program fee and inclusions

- 1.1. The program fee quoted in this Study Tour Quotation is valid only for December 2023-January 2024. Dates to be confirmed.
- 1.2. The program fee quoted in this Study Tour Quotation is based on 10 - 15 students, and is therefore an estimate that is subject to revision once the number of students and accompanying staff attending the Study Tour is finalised.
- 1.3. The program fee quoted in this Study Tour Quotation includes single (1 student per room) or twin (2 students per room) placement homestay accommodation and meals.
- 1.4. The program fee does not include daily transfers for students.
- 1.5. Unless specifically stated under the Program Costs section of this Quotation:
  - 1.5.1. The program fee does not include any airfares or medical and travel insurance; and
  - 1.5.2. Arrangements for airfares and medical and travel insurance are the responsibility of the Study Tour participants.
- 1.6. All fees in this Study Tour Quotation are in AUD and include GST.

### 2. Documentation requirements, bookings and cancellation

- 2.1. All documentation required by UOW College for the Study Tour must be completed and received by UOW College at least four weeks before the Study Tour is to start, or at time of booking if booking is less than four weeks before the Study Tour start.
- 2.2. Bookings made at least 8 weeks prior to the program commencement must be accompanied by a non-refundable deposit of 20% of the total program fee.
- 2.3. Bookings made less than 8 weeks but at least four weeks prior to the program commencement must be accompanied by a non-refundable deposit of 100% of the total program fee.
- 2.4. Bookings made less than 4 weeks prior to the program commencement must be accompanied by a non-refundable deposit of 100% of the total program fee plus a late fee to cover increased administration costs of 5% of the total program fee.
- 2.5. There is no binding agreement in place until UOW College has notified you of acceptance of your booking, and this Quotation may be withdrawn or amended by UOW College without notice at any time prior to the acceptance of your booking by UOW College. UOW College retains the right not to accept any booking, which it may do at its discretion in circumstances including but not limited to where it has reached full capacity for your intended dates. In those circumstances UOW College will use all reasonable endeavours



to offer you alternative dates or arrangements acceptable to you and UOW College. If such alternative arrangements involve increased costs, UOW College will advise you of these and if the arrangements are accepted by you, you will be responsible for payment of the increased costs.

- 2.6. Full payment must be received two weeks prior to the commencement of the program. UOW College may cancel the Study Tour where full payment has not been received by this date.
- 2.7. For individual student cancellation requests received 2 weeks or more prior to the program commencement, 50% of the student's program fees will be refunded.
- 2.8. For individual student cancellation requests received less than 2 weeks prior to the program commencement, there will be no refund of any part of the student's program fees except in extenuating circumstances, when clause 2.9 below will apply.
- 2.9. UOW College will use its discretion to consider requests for refunds where extenuating circumstances exist.

### 3. Welfare and safety of Study Tour participants

- 3.1. Each Study Tour participant (including students, teachers/group leaders and any other participants) must take out and maintain travel and medical insurances for the entire duration of the program.
- 3.2. Each study tour participant under the age of 18 years must be accompanied by a suitable guardian who will take responsibility for the safety and welfare of that participant during the Study Tour.
- 3.3. To the maximum extent permitted by law, UOW College and its related bodies corporate exclude all liability, whether in tort, contract or under statute, for any loss, injury or other harm to any participant in the Study Tour or inflicted upon any person by a participant in the Study Tour.
- 3.4. Each Study Tour participant may undertake volunteer activities with Third Parties during their Study Tour. Whilst UOW College and its related bodies corporate will assist in the arrangements of these volunteer activities UOW College and its related bodies corporate will not be liable for any damages (for example, personal injury or property damage) that may occur during the carrying out of these activities.
- 3.5. In the event that clause 3.3 is ineffective in excluding UOW College's liability, that liability, howsoever arising, shall, to the extent permitted by law, be limited to a maximum of the Program Fee paid by any one person.
- 3.6. UOW College will not be responsible for any costs associated with missed transport connections, errors in transport details and/or failure to attend scheduled activities. Costs associated with these events will be borne by Study Tour participants.

### 4. Activities

- 4.1. All activities are subject to availability. The included activities program is a sample one and to be confirmed after the acceptance of the program quote.
- 4.2. Due to inclement weather, heavy traffic and other forces beyond our control activities may have to be cancelled or rescheduled to an alternate activity.
- 4.3. All participants must be on time for activities to avoid delaying the program.
- 4.4. Identification lanyards must be worn at all times for safety purposes (for students under 18 only).

### 5. Travel arrangements and activities outside those planned and coordinated by UOW College



- 5.1. If Study Tour participants make arrangements for travel or activities outside of, or instead of, travel or activities planned and coordinated by UOW College, they do so at their own risk. Any responsibility held by UOW College towards Study Tour participants is suspended during their participation in activities outside of those planned and coordinated by UOW College.
